## WOMEN'S RETREAT AND RENEWAL



## HOMELESS MINISTRY

Thank you for helping the homeless realize that there are people who really care about them. They are very appreciative of us coming to see them on a regular basis.

We served 6,670 lunches (16,209) sandwiches to 5,259 people (167 women) in 2016. We could not begin to make the sandwiches without the work of Judi Leisk, who coordinates the bread pickups, and the wonderful people who pick up the bread. We are blessed to have many of you come and help us prepare the sandwiches and the lunches. You make it possible for us to have 700 sandwiches and 300 complete lunches ready each time.

Phylis and Mike Karas work all year putting together toiletry packages. We provided 3,106 men and 239 women with much needed toiletry items. Socks were provided during the year and rain ponchos were provided in December. Since we began providing toiletries from 2005 through 2016, we have provided 37,755 toiletry packages.

This year we asked the homeless what they would like since we knew cold weather was approaching. They wanted sweatshirts with hoods. CTS Council provided 288 zippered hoodies to the homeless. They were very surprised and excited to receive these new hoodies. The rain ponchos and the hoodies were so needed since the weather has changed so drastically to rain and cold. Can you imagine what it is like to sleep outside in the rain and cold?

YOUR thoughtfulness goes a long way in bringing comfort to others less fortunate.

## WORSHIP AND MUSIC

Christ the Servant has “gone green” for the month of February, since it is the liturgical color for Epiphany. Ash Wednesday is March 1 and Easter is late this year – April 16.

The music program at Christ the Servant is staying busy. We are now in the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of the Reformation. The January Reformation Evening Prayer service at Memorial Drive Lutheran was very successful. We will return to Christ the Servant on March 26 at 4:00 p.m. for a look at “Luther’s Catechism in Song.” Luther wrote hymns about each part of the catechism, and the ELCA has asked its congregations to look at the catechism during Lent (as we will do). Doing so by way of Luther’s music is a natural thing to do. The ELCA is offering an online catechism course, and it is available for upload for a few days.

On a personal note, I will be doing a radio program on KKHT 100.7 FM beginning February 19 at 6:00 p.m. Its title is “Martin Luther – With Eyes of Faith,” and will discuss Luther’s life, work, and (of course) his music. There will be interviews, music and discussion (and perhaps guest appearances from the staff here). The show will stream on The Christ the Servant website as well as on Facebook. This is a fabulous opportunity to share what I have learned about Luther over the years, and I am very excited about doing this.

The abstract for a paper on Martin Luther’s communion hymns I submitted to Societas Liturgica has been accepted. I am now working out the financing with that organization, and hopefully will present it at the University of Leuven (Belgium) in August. This will be plenty to keep us busy during a season of rest.

## THURSDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY

How does the old saying go...a picture is worth a thousand words? There is some debate as to the origin of this English idiom. A 1918 advertisement for the San Antonio Light is one option.

When the word comes from God, I think the reverse probably applies. The Gospel according to John will be the topic of discussion for the Tuesday Night Bible Study Group beginning on Feb 14<sup>th</sup>. As you may know, it is thought that the opening verses come from an early Christian hymn used in Johannine circles. You probably know the opening: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

Well, that will be the starting point for 8 sessions on the Gospel of John running every other Tuesday night from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm in the CTS conference room from Feb thru May.

The group is led by Ken Smith and Richard Carlson; however, we plan to rotate leadership of individual sessions to other members of the group, just like we did last spring when the group spent 12 sessions covering the Gospel of Mark. We plan to use several of Pastor Jim's favorite commentaries including Symbolism in the Fourth Gospel by Craig Koester.

Presently, the group consists of about 20 people with attendance ranging from 10 to 14 on any given (every other) Tuesday evening. If you have an interest in joining the group, just show up on a Tuesday night even if it is to just to take a look, which you are more than welcome to do.


