SAFELY RETURNING TO WORSHIP

During the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic CTS staff and Council have worked diligently to prepare for the time when we can return to worship in person. That time is now at hand. We will return to in-person worship with our normal 8:00 and 11:00 services on **Pentecost Sunday, May 31**. In so doing we are taking extra precautionary steps to try to ensure the health and safety of our congregation, and to comply with all federal, state, and local guidelines and regulations.

We recognize that in the current environment some people may not feel safe in social gatherings. We leave it to each individual to decide whether he or she is comfortable attending in-person worship and will certainly respect that decision. **For our vulnerable members and those who prefer to not attend in person we will live stream services and also make podcasts available for viewing on the internet** (<https://www.christtheservant.net/>). For those members who choose to attend in person, we urge you to practice good hygiene, wash your hands, and follow the medical guidance of the CDC or your personal physician. **If you are experiencing symptoms (cough, fever, chills, etc.) we strongly encourage you seek medical attention and stay at home until you have recovered.**

In order that our members may make an informed decision on whether to attend in person, and to know what to expect, we have prepared a detailed plan that is posted on our website. A brief summary is as follows:

- Ushers will guide people to their seats in the sanctuary to ensure adequate social distancing between groups. Families will be seated together. Seating in the sanctuary will be limited to comply with current regulations, with the narthex available for overflow if necessary. It may take a bit longer to seat all members and we ask you to plan your arrival time accordingly.
- Service volunteers will continue to play very important roles in our worship services. They have worked with the staff and Council to develop appropriate procedures to mitigate the risk of spreading the coronavirus.
- Hymnals, Bibles, worship booklets, pens, and attendance pads will be removed from the pews in the sanctuary.
- A self-contained worship booklet will be created each Sunday and will include hymns and lessons that can be discarded after each service. This booklet will be handed out by the Greeters. For those interested in going paperless, a QR code will be available at the entrance to the sanctuary. Congregants can simply scan the code with the camera on their phone or tablet and it should bring up an electronic copy of the worship booklet.
- Gloves and masks will be provided for those who wish to use them but will not be required in the sanctuary unless mandated by local authorities.
- The offering plate will be placed on a table in the center aisle for people to use when they enter or exit.
- We will refrain from shaking hands or hugging at this time. We will pass the peace only to people seated nearby with a simple bow and greeting.
- Communion will be received in a continuous line with recipients spaced to provide adequate social distancing. The Pastor and Liturgical Assistant will devote extra attention to hygiene and sanitation.
- We will continue to use music as a key part of the worship experience. We will mitigate the perceived risk of spreading the coronavirus while singing by increased social distancing between the Choir, Cantor and seated attendees. For congregational singing, attendees will be encouraged to hold their music sheets in front of their faces to prevent projecting aerosols.
- The ushers will dismiss people by row. Attendees should not shake hands with the Pastor and other service volunteers when exiting the sanctuary.
- We are taking extra steps to clean and sanitize the facilities, including disinfecting the sanctuary, sacristy, and liturgical objects between services.
- The fellowship hall, kitchen, narthex, and conference room will remain closed for the time being. We plan to open the rest of the facility in **July** for Homeless Ministry, Adult Sunday School, and other activities.

Staff and Council will incorporate lessons learned and make adjustments as the summer progresses. We welcome suggestions at any time from our members!



WORSHIP AND MUSIC

I am going to forgo my series on the liturgy this month in view of the reopening of the church and changes to worship coming with it. These are covered in a general way in the statement from the council and staff in this issue. However, there are a few points I would like to highlight.

First, there will be no books in the pews for a while. They will be replaced by one-time use booklets or by an electronic version available by a QR code posted near the sanctuary doors. As an odd aside, the booklets are a “droplet blocker.” Hold them high while singing.

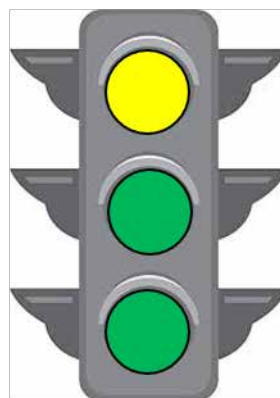
Second, once the appropriate media can be installed and sanitizing between services is ensured, we plan to have a “safe room” set up in the fellowship hall with both video and audio feeds of the worship service. The tables are six feet apart. Family units can sit together, but individuals should sit two to a table.

Third, choir singing will be limited to quartets. This won't be a problem in early service but may take a little work in the second service. In addition, the only people seated in the “music” section of the pews will be the musicians and a/v personnel.

Fourth, the choir, cantors, and I will be singing without masks because doing so will muffle the sound to the point of being unintelligible. As for the congregation, please use masks if you feel more comfortable. Reports from both the CDC and the Military University of Munich indicate that safe distancing and good room ventilation (which we have in both the sanctuary and fellowship hall) are effective defenses with or without masks, excepting unguarded sneezes and coughs.

The liturgy (and music) is a ritual, and rituals can adapt or change. For example, the cup was taken from the laity in 1025 because of a plague. Heinrich Schutz wrote music for the people he had during the Thirty Years' War, which is what I will be doing going forward. “This is the Feast” has more or less replaced the Gloria starting with the Green hymnal in 1978. Whether or not these current changes are permanent, we will continue to adapt as conditions dictate.

While we've been away...

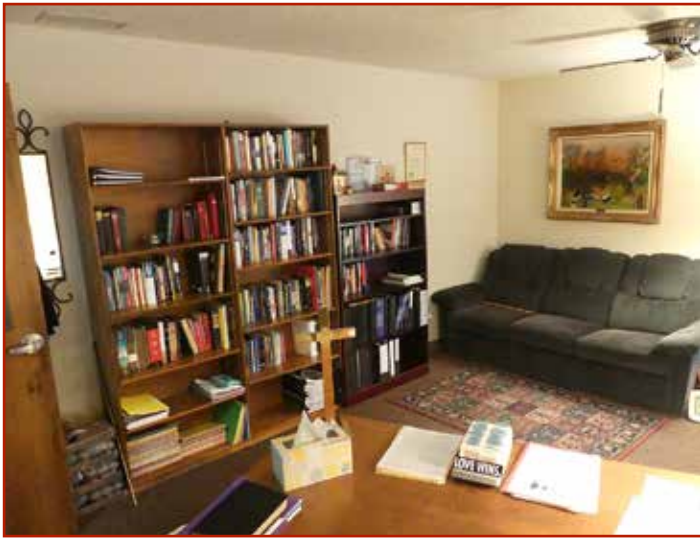


Houston Food Bank distributing food purchased with funds from the CTS Opportunity Endowment Fund.

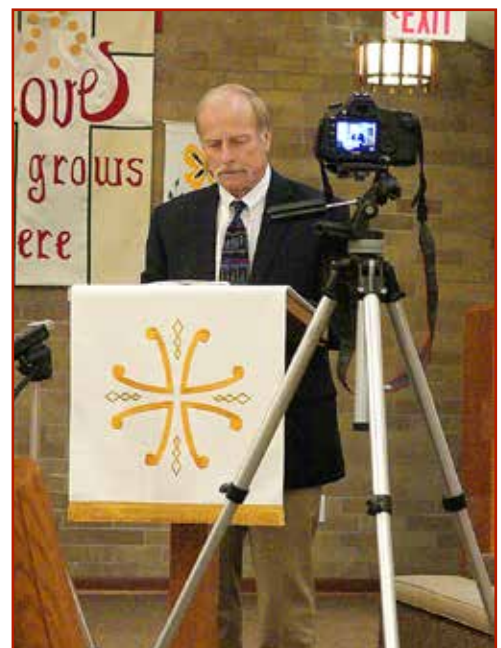
Pastor Jim cleaned out his office for the first time in years. The dumpster was full! There's plenty of room to gather new ideas now.

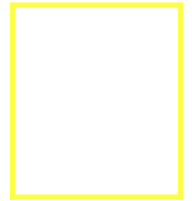


JT, Pastor Jim and John Krueger continued to perfect filming of services, skills that will carry on even once we are able to resume in-person services.
